There are seven days in a week. *Hay siete días en una semana.*  
 Monday to Friday are the weekdays. *Los días de lunes a viernes no son en el fin de semana.*

Saturday and Sunday are the weekend. *El sábado y el domingo son el fin de semana.*  
 When there is a holiday on Monday or Friday, we have a "three-day weekend." *Cuando hay día festivo el lunes o el viernes, tenemos un el viernes, tenemos un fin de semana de tres días.*

Do you know a holiday that has a three-day weekend? *¿Conoces algún día festivo que tenga un fin de semana de tres días?*

When are your normal days off? *¿Cuándo están tus días libres habituales?*

My days off are Thursday and Sunday. *Mis días libres son jueves y domingo.*

My English class is on Tuesdays. *Mi clase de inglés es cada martes.*

I have English class Tuesdays. *Tengo una clase de inglés cada martes.*

*“On” es opcional con los nombres de días, pero “on” es obligatorio en la frase “on the weekend.”*

Do they work on the weekend? *¿Ellos trabajan el fin de semana?*

Yes, they work Saturdays. *Sí, ellos trabajan los sábados.*

Yes, they work on Saturdays. *Sí, ellos trabajan los sábados.*

No, they only work on the weekdays. *No, solo trabajan los días que no son el fin de semana.*

In normal weeks I work on Thursdays, *En semanas normales trabajo los jueves,*

but this week I don't work on Thursday. *pero esta semana no trabajo el jueves.*

When is the restaurant closed? *¿Cuándo está cerrado el restaurante?*

The restaurant is closed Mondays. *El restaurante está cerrado los lunes.*
